• Owner of my own business: "Lisa's Sew & Tux."

Volunteer positions:

• I am one of the founders of a nonprofit called Totes for Tots & Teens (Project T3), founded in 2004, and am still a board member. We help children in foster care, group homes, and shelters in 15 counties in Southeastern Indiana by giving them a tote bag filled with personal items, along with many other items they may need when they are removed from their families. We also supply the children with "back to school" backpacks filled with their school supplies.

Volunteer positions (continued):

- Also, I am one of the founders of the nonprofit Batesville Area Resource Center, organized in 2014. I am still on the board, and I am their new Administrator. This center houses nonprofits that help the underprivileged and lower income individuals who are in need of assistance. We now house the Batesville Food Pantry, the Southeastern Indiana Health Clinic, Southeastern Indiana Economic Opportunity Corporation, One Community One Family, Choices, Crisis Pregnancy Hotline, Project T3, the So Loved Closet, and the Laughery Township Trustee.
- Finally, I am a member of the Phi Beta Psi Sorority Xi Chapter. I have held many offices, including President & Treasurer. I was awarded the National Presidents Award while I held the Xi Chapter office. I have become very active with this sorority since I am now fighting cancer myself and can see the need to help local cancer patients in many different ways. Our main goal is cancer research and helping our local cancer patients that are in need or just need to be cheered up. I was able to start a new fundraiser for the sorority called "Soups & Sips" to help fund the cancer projects. Our first year was January 2016 and since then it has become our biggest money maker (even during the Covid years by thinking outside of the box). We are so fortunate that Batesville is a very giving community, not just with monetary donations but with people giving their time to help those in need. We also have a phenomenal cancer center here that is happy to work with our organization.
